

VICTORY FOR FAMILIES: CITY COUNCIL PROTECTS CHILDREN EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS BY PASSING INTRO 123

NEW YORK, NY – Christine C. Quinn, President & CEO of Win, the largest provider of housing and supportive services for homeless families with children in New York City and the nation, issued the following statement today in response to the City Council passing Intro 123, a groundbreaking law that ensures children are no longer required to be physically present at intake facilities when their families apply or reapply for shelter placement.
