## Win and AT&T Partner to Give Laptops to College-Bound Seniors Experiencing Homelessness

AT&T donates 50 laptops college-bound high school seniors living within the Win shelter system

**NEW YORK, NY**— With commencement ceremonies underway across New York, Win, the nation's largest provider of family shelter and supportive housing, partnered with AT&T to deliver laptops to 50 college-bound seniors living within the Win shelter system. The donation by AT&T, celebrated today in a ceremony with students and leadership from AT&T and Win, aims to bridge the digital equity gap disproportionately shouldered by those living in shelter, empowering students as they take the next steps in their academic careers.

"Graduating high school and getting accepted into college is an incredible feat for any student, and even more so for children experiencing homelessness. Our graduating seniors at Win have been forced to navigate challenging obstacles and instability, yet have persevered against the odds in pursuit of this ultimate goal," said **Christine Quinn, President & CEO of Win**. "AT&T's generous donation ensures these students are equipped for success as they embark on a new journey and their academic careers. We commend these students for their tremendous fortitude and thank AT&T for their commitment to empowering our students."

Today's donation comes amid <u>a 39% increase in the homeless student population</u> - equating to roughly 29,000 children in shelter each month in 2023. For these students, the high school drop-out rate is more than three times higher than that of their permanently housed peers, while the on-time graduation rate for those in shelter stands at just 64%.

"Access to connectivity is vital in helping to bridge the digital equity gap. At AT&T, collaborating with great organizations like Win helps us bring the right resources and the right technology to the right places. We're excited to celebrate these graduating seniors and play a role in helping them make their dreams a reality.
